

TCS House

Tata Consultancy Services changed its corporate residence last year, moving into a heritage building that overlooks a rare green expanse in the heart of Mumbai. Built in 1922 and renovated in 2007, the building has history on its side, not to mention grandeur and class that befits its wonderful frame.



1. The Greek inscription carved on the front-door stone lintel of the building has been spruced up. It says — ‘Walk the straight line’.
2. TCS House [formerly Rallis House] overlooking the Azad Maidan in Mumbai is a Grade II A heritage building. Aglow in the evening it stands out among surrounding buildings in all splendour.

The transformation carried out by architectural firm, Somaya and Kalappa, took 18 months and has given the building an interesting contrast — heavy stone structure on the outside with contemporary state-of-the-art interiors. TCS House gives an inspiration to move forward even while proudly holding on to the past.

8. The open terrace on the fifth floor is connected with a cantilevered staircase. Done partially in wood and decked up with greenery, it is a oasis in the concrete jungle of the fort area of Mumbai.

9. The state-of-the-art media room can seat more than 40 people.

10. The waiting area has a wall of glass on one side, bringing in a lot of light. It is simple, yet elegant, making visitors feel at home.
